

Shri J. K. Maheshwari ji

Hon. Justice, Supreme Court of India

His Lordship was born on June 29, 1961 in a small town of Jaura, District Morena (M.P.). His Lordship graduated with an Honours in Arts1982 and passed LL.B. in 1985, then completed LL.M degree from Jiwaji University, Gwalior in 1991.

His Lordship was enrolled as an Advocate with the State Bar Council of Madhya Pradesh on November 22, 1985 and practiced in Civil, Criminal, Constitutional, Service and Tax matters in the High Court of Madhya Pradesh mainly at Gwalior Bench and Principal Seat at Jabalpur and the Supreme Court of India. His Lordship appeared before CAT regularly and various other tribunals in the State of Madhya Pradesh.

His Lordship was also Member of M.P. State Bar Council since the year 2002 till elevation and was the Chairman of Disciplinary Committee, Gwalior Bench and worked in various other committees of M.P. State Bar Council. His Lordship was elevated as Additional Judge of the High Court of Madhya Pradesh on November 25, 2005 and made permanent on November 25, 2008. In the State of M.P. Hon'ble Chief Justice constituted various committees to assign the administrative works and responsibilities to the Hon'ble Judges.

His Lordship was the First Chief Justice of newly established Andhra Pradesh High Court. During the short span of 15 months, His Lordship has disposed more than 4500 cases. In the High Court of Andhra Pradesh Virtual Court was started on 25.03.2020. It was the first High Court to hear the cases by virtual mode at that time. During pandemic more than 94,000 cases were heard by Hon'ble Judges during the tenure of His Lordship though the strength was only of 20 Judges. As per the e-Committee Report of the Hon'ble Supreme Court, Andhra Pradesh High Court was the second High Court which heard the highest cases during the pandemic.

Under the guidance of his Lordship 'e-filing module' was also developed for online filing of the cases in the High Court and Subordinate Courts during the COVID-19 Pandemic time and the Rules were also framed.

His Lordship was transferred as the Chief Justice of the High Court of Sikkim on January 06, 2021. His Lordship has taken oath as a Judge of the Supreme Court of India on August 31, 2021.

His lordship is also actively involved in various religious and social activities. Recently he had conducted a free medical camp for thousands of people with highly qualified doctors and latest medical equipments in the town of Jaura, Madhya Pradesh on the death anniversary of his mother.



Guest of Honour

Shri Anilkumar ji Lahoti

Chairman, Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI)

Mr. Anil Kumar Lahoti, Chairman, Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) was born in 1963 in Guna district of Madhya Pradesh. His father, freedom fighter Late Shri Ratan Lal Lahoti ji, was a senior advocate of Guna district and an active social worker. His mother, Late Kanchan Devi Lahoti, was a religious housewife with unwavering faith in Indian values, who inspired the family to go on the path of education. His elder brother, Late Justice Shri Ramesh Chandra Lahoti graced the highest post in the Indian judiciary. Shri Anil Kumar Lahoti's wife, Mrs. Menu Lahoti is a housewife and social worker and his son Shri Pravek Lahoti is working in a fintech start-up company in Bengaluru as Investment and Advisory Head.

Mr. Anil Kumar Lahoti is a 1984 batch officer of Indian Railway Service of Engineers. After a long service of 37 years in Indian Railways, he retired as Chairman & CEO of Railway Board on 31st August 2023. He is a graduate in Civil Engineering with Gold Medal from Madhav Institute of Technology & Science, Gwalior and a Masters in Engineering (Structures) from IIT Roorkee. He has served in various capacities in Central, Northern, North Central, Western and West Central Railways as well as Railway Board.

Apart from Chairman and CEO, Railway Board, Shri Anil Kumar Lahoti has also held important positions like Member Infrastructure, Railway Board; General Manager of Central Railway and Western Railway; Divisional Railway Manager, Lucknow (Northern Railway); Chief Administrative Officer (Construction), Northern Railway and Executive Director, Railway Board. After retirement, he was appointed by the Ministry of Railways as a One-Man Expert Committee for improving track inspection and maintenance. In December 2023, he was appointed as a Distinguished Visiting Professor by Gati Shakti University, Vadodara (Central University). On January 30, 2024, the Government of India appointed him as the Chairman of Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI).

His expertise includes railway operations, track maintenance, project execution, station redevelopment, telecom and broadcasting. During his illustrious career, Shri Lahoti introduced several reforms in execution of infrastructure projects and took several initiatives to modernize and mechanize track maintenance on Indian Railways. During his tenure as CRB & CEO, GM & DRM, he brought significant improvement in freight transport performance and took several customer friendly initiatives to improve quality of service and ease customer interface. After assuming charge as Chairman, TRAI, Shri Lahoti has taken several initiatives for reforms in the areas of telecom and broadcasting and made several recommendations to the Government of India.



A Glimpse into MVPM Scholar Award's Objective and Selection Process

Respected community members,

It is with great pleasure that I extend a warm welcome to all as we approach the MVPM Scholar Awards 2023 (10th edition), a celebration of academic excellence and potential within our community. As the Chairman of the scrutiny committee, I am honoured to provide insights into the fundamental objectives of our prestigious award and the rigorous scientific methodologies employed to identify the most deserving candidates.

Objective of the Award:

The primary aim of our Scholar Award program is to recognize and support individuals who exhibit outstanding academic achievements in their respective fields of specializations during graduation and beyond. Furthermore, the final stage of the selection process also involves additional assessment of exemplary leadership qualities and a commitment to community service. We believe in investing in the future by empowering bright minds from our Maheshwari community to pursue their educational aspirations, thereby contributing to the overall development of our community.

Quick snapshot for MVPM 2023 Scholar Award applications:

The last two editions of MVPM Scholar Awards had 139 and 140 applicants respectively. The current edition has received a whopping 219 applications, which is a testament to the growing impact and popularity of these awards in our community.

We have also seen a healthy increase in the number of female candidates from our community applying for these awards with the gender ratio Male: Female breaching 60:40 mark this year.

Every year, we reassess the list of disciplines as categories for reference so that there is no bias towards any specific domain and yet we continue to keep up with the times wherein more and more study pathways and career options are available for the youth. Just to highlight this phenomenon, we had an applicant who graduated with majors in humanities from IIT Bombay and an applicant who has a specialised degree in music from a leading school in Valencia, Spain!

Selection Process:

Our commitment to objectivity and fairness is aptly reflected in the meticulous selection process that consists of three broad stages:

- Round 1: Screening | The application is submitted via the official MVPM Scholar website through an
 online form that consists of basic information and details of the academic journey, key milestones and
 achievements. The primary objective at this stage is to check whether the applications meet the eligibility
 criteria such as month and year of graduation, member of Maheshwari community, recognized academic
 degrees etc.
- Round 2: Scrutiny | A detailed application form (to be signed physically by the applicant and their parents; scanned copy for submission) is shared with the eligible candidates and details are requested along with proofs of their degrees, scorecards, accolades etc. Once the detailed application forms with documentation is received (subject to a deadline), they are assessed and rated numerically against the following variables on a pre-defined scale that is normalised with relevant weightages for objective assessment:

Academic Excellence Assessment:

Rigorous scrutiny of academic records, achievements, and performance is conducted to identify candidates with consistently high academic standards. This includes a thorough evaluation of grades, standardized test scores, academic recognition and excellence.

Institution & qualifying degree/ pathway:

The ranking of an institution is a key criteria considered for the profile assessment. The institutions are colleges, universities, and autonomous bodies etc. that award the degrees or a pathway unlocked by meritorious candidates only. We use several yardsticks that are relevant for the different streams to assess the ratings. Eg. For domestic universities we consider the NIRF rankings, for foreign universities we consider QS Global rankings etc. Pathways such as Civil services and degrees awarded by autonomous bodies such as ICAI are measured on a separate baseline to ensure that there is a level playing field for all applicants.

Holistic Achievement Evaluation:

Beyond academics, we recognize the importance of a well-rounded individual. Candidates are assessed for their involvement in extracurricular activities, leadership roles, and notable accomplishments in areas such as sports, arts, or community service.

• **Round 3: Jury** | **Final round** that consists of an eminent jury board that interviews the candidates shortlisted in the Scrutiny round.

As a practice, we always strive to get feedback from the jury panel on selection process and continuously strive to improve the entire process of evaluation and make it as objective as possible.

The scores from the Scrutiny round are considered as a baseline for the final interviews conducted by the Jury board. Additional elements come into play in the final round as follows:

Personal Statements and Interviews:

Applicants are given the opportunity to share their personal journeys, aspirations, and the impact they hope to make on the community. Personal statements and interviews allow the committee to understand the candidates on a deeper level, beyond their academic and extracurricular achievements.

Anonymous Review Process by the Jury:

To eliminate biases, our selection process ensures that the reviewing committee does not have access to the applicants' personal information during the initial stages. This anonymity fosters an objective evaluation based solely on merit and data.

A weighted average of the scores from the scrutiny round and the final interview are usually considered to arrive at the final shortlist of the awardees.

The decision taken by the eminent jury board to identify and award the final list of recipients of MVPM Scholars and Promising Scholars shall always be final & binding.

MVPM Maheshwari scholar Award Program

The Genesis

Maheshwari community is considered to be one of the leading business communities in India. Economic contribution of Maheshwaris has been well acknowledged. While being at the forefront of business, industry and trade, Maheshwaris have achieved exceptional feats in educational pursuits too. But business achievements of Maheshvaris are so overwhelming that the community's academic achievements go unnoticed. Having realized this Maheshwari Vidya Pracharak Mandal (MVPM) decided to make its humble contribution towards correcting this perception. As a step in that direction MVPM instituted MVPM's Maheshwari Scholar Awards in 2012 aimed at giving academic recognition to the community which it deserves. The awards recognize extraordinary scholastic achievements of such Maheshwaris who can serve as role models for the youth of our community.

The Award

The MVPM's Maheshwari Scholars are identified from among Maheshwari students all across the globe with outstanding academic records in higher education. They come from very diverse backgrounds like Engineering, Medical, Finance, Management, Law etc. Besides,Ph.Ds& UPSC qualified candidates are also eligible to apply. In selection of awardees there is no fixed number of awards for various educational disciplines. In extreme case all can be from same discipline & none can be from a specific discipline. Neither is any consideration for gender or economic background of applicants. The applicants are evaluated primarily on their scholastic achievements.

In all there are three category of awards, viz. Maheshwari Scholar Award, Promising Maheshwari Scholar Award and Emerging Maheshwari Scholar Award. Each Maheshwari Scholar & Promising Maheshwari Scholar is given a Gold Medal besides Citation. Emerging Maheshwari Scholars are given a citation. In order to recognise any exceptional talent among chosen awardees there is a provision for Outstanding Maheshwari Scholar Award. Besides, a 'Maheshwari Scholar Icon' award in the form of a citation is given to a senior Maheshwari for his/ her scholastic contributions over several years.

The Selection Process

To be eligible for awards one needs to apply in a structured format specified by Scholar Committee. There is also provision for online submission of application forms. There is no provision for nomination in student category. Only candidates who have passed their under-graduate (UG) or Post-graduate (PG) exams or obtained Ph.D or qualified UPSC between 1st October of preceding year & 30th September current year are considered eligible.

From all the applications received, applicants with outstanding scholastic record are shortlisted for a telephonic interview with a jury comprising people who have themselves been scholars and have related achievements to their credit.

On the basis of evaluation by the jury a certain number of awardees are chosen as Maheshwari Scholar, Promising Maheshwari Scholar and Emerging Maheshwari Scholar. Maheshwari Scholar Icon awardee is nominated and chosen by the Managing Committee. There is no provision for application in this category.

The Scholars

The applicants for Scholar awards come from all across the globe including Australia, USA, UK, Germany, Spain & Japan. Within India they come from various states like Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Karnataka Madhya Pradesh, Odisha, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Telangana, Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal, and of course Maharashtra.

Over the years Maheshwari Scholar Awards have been scaling newer heights in terms of scholastic achievements. Here is a sample of few achievers. Dr Dinesh Bharadia the recipient of Outstanding Maheshwari Scholar award was included in Forbes list of America's top 30 under 30. Dr Zarana Maheshwari, completed her Ph.D in English Literature with flying colours despite having lost her eyesight. Nishant Totla, the 2012 awardee had received all India rank 2 in IIT – JEE, which is described as world's toughest entrance exam. Another scholar Sanjay Navandhar achieved all India rank 1 in the prestigious CA exam. Laya Maheshwari, one of the awardees went for further studies to Harvard Law School. Darshit Jaju, an IIT – IIM alumnus, was included in The Economic Times top 50 Emerging Leaders of Corporate India.


Eighty four Maheshwaris who received Scholar and Promising Scholar Awards in last seven years include fifteen Ph.Ds from top global universities like Stanford, Cornell, Massachusetts University and INSEAD etc; twenty one engineers from IITs, BITS, Pilani, Georgia Tech, etc; eighteen doctors including super specialists like DM and M.Ch and alumnus of AIIMS, New Delhi; thirteen finance professionals including CA AIR 1, 3 & 5, CS AIR 2 and CMA AIR 8; nine management postgraduates all from IIMs or XLRI; five Public Service Exam qualifiers like IPS, IRS etc; and three from humanities side from top institutions like Cambridge University, London School of Economics, and New York University. 



A Real-Life Case Study of Startup Failure: Pepper Tap

Overview:

Founded in 2014, PepperTap was an online grocery marketplace that operated on a "100% inventory-less" model, sourcing inventory from local stores and listing it on its app. Within a year, it became a leading player in the online grocery space, operating in 31 cities and processing 20,000 orders daily. The company raised \$51 million in funding from prominent investors like Sequoia Capital, SAIF Partners, and Snapdeal within just 15 months of its launch.

Downfall - In 2015, PepperTap closed operations in smaller cities like Agra and Meerut after finding them unprofitable. By early 2016, the company shut down in 10 more cities, including major metros like Mumbai, Chennai and Kolkata, leading to the layoff of around 400 employees. Despite narrowing its focus to key cities such as Delhi, Gurgaon and Bangalore, which accounted for 70% of its revenue, PepperTap eventually ceased operations entirely in April 2016.

Reasons for Failure:

Heavy discounts (up to 70%). Challenges with the zero-inventory model. Product glitches and lack of sustainable growth planning. Overexpansion without profitability focus. Decline in VC funding.

A Real-Life Case Study of Startup Success: Zomato

Overview:

Founded in 2008 by Deepinder Goyal and Pankaj Chaddah, Zomato began as a restaurant discovery platform in India. Over time, it expanded into food delivery, online table reservations, and B2B services, becoming one of the world's leading food-tech companies.

Key Strategies for Success:

- 1. **Customer-Centric Approach**: Zomato addressed urban India's need for convenient food options by offering detailed restaurant reviews, menus, and later, swift food delivery services.
- 2. **Innovative Offerings:** With services like Zomato Gold (now Pro) for discounts and Hyperpure for quality restaurant supplies, it created an ecosystem benefiting both customers and partners.
- 3. **Technology-Driven**: Zomato leveraged Al and analytics to improve delivery efficiency, user experience and personalization.
- 4. **Global Expansion:** The platform entered 24 countries, adapting its services to local markets and acquiring competitors like Uber Eats India.
- 5. **Funding and IPO:** Secured significant investments from Tiger Global, Sequoia Capital, and others, raising \$1.26 billion through its IPO in 2021.
- 6. **Inorganic Growth:** Zomato continues to expand its business by acquiring startups in related sectors, such as its buyout of Blinkit and stake purchase in Adonmo, among others.

Impact:

Zomato revolutionized India's food-tech space, serving millions of users and empowering thousands of restaurants. Its adaptability, innovation, and focus on customer satisfaction cemented its position as a startup success story.

Success in competitive exams is about more than intelligence or hard work. Here are four critical differentiating factors:

1. Understand Yourself

Avoid blindly following the crowd. Begin by identifying your unique strengths, weaknesses, and goals. Where do you stand now, and where do you want to go? Chart your path based on your abilities, weaknesses and aspirations not someone else's.

2. Work Smart

Efficient preparation is key. Focus on mastering concepts, identify your optimal study times, and address areas of improvement. Consistently evaluate your progress and adjust your strategy when needed. Remember, quality trumps quantity.

3. Compete with Yourself

Competing with peers can lead to stress on one hand or complacency on the other. Instead, measure your progress against your past performance. Aim for consistent self-improvement. This is a differentiator which most of the students don't consider.

4. Stay Calm

Your efforts will culminate in one critical exam day. Anxiety can undo months of preparation. And stress & anxiety are something that affects almost every student. What went wrong?

- He didn't dedicate enough time to his weaker subject
- Group studies are usually less effective. His group lacked complementary strengths
- Arun prioritized hard work over smart work. He didn't analyse his answers to the practice papers
 which gives the best individual insights which subject / topics needs improvement, do I need to
 improve my speed, did I make silly mistakes & why, how can I address them. These insights are the
 most precious in personal growth
- He let anxiety build up, which further impacted the performance

With better self-awareness, focus on physics, and smarter study practices, Arun could have significantly improved his performance. Regular meditation might have also helped him manage stress and enhance focus.

Final Thoughts

Even after doing everything right, if you don't make it to your dream college, remember: it's not the end of the world. Opportunities abound beyond IITs or other premier institutions. Success lies in resilience, adaptability, and the willingness to keep striving. After all, many achievers didn't attend IIT—and they've thrived!
